REFLECTIONS FROM CLA

I think Carlson Leadership Academy had a profound impact on my professional development and my mindset of being in the Sigma Phi Epsilon fraternity. We covered numerous topics such as Leadership and Public Speaking, which are two I thought were invaluable, as well as chapter-specific skills such as Recruitment and Retention. LEE ZASTROW SCHOLARSHIP GETS ENDOWED

The AVC is proud to announce that due to a generous \$50,000+ gift commitment by Howard Zastrow, Brother Zastrow's father; the Lee Zastrow memorial scholarship will be expanded and endowed! The Lee Zastrow scholarship was first created by the brothers of Lee's graduating class shortly after his unexpected and untimely passing in 2003. The scholarship eventually went dormant until a couple years ago when a generous donation by volunteer Deb Putnam revived the scholarship which was first awarded last spring. Unfortunately the AVC had lost contact with Lee's family but with 25-Year on the horizon an effort was made to trace and reach out to the family. Eventually a couple Board members were able to find Lee's sister and reached out. She happily got us in touch with the rest of the family so that we could make sure that they were on the invite list. It was at this time that we shared that we had revived the scholarship and had kept Brother Zastrow's name alive within the chapter.

In January the AVC was contacted by the UWP Foundation and informed that Howard wanted to endow the Lee Zastrow scholarship. Through talks with the Foundation and Howard, it was agreed upon to expand the Zastrow memorial scholarships by creating a new student Rising Leader scholarship and an Excellence in Leadership Award. Both awards will be presented alongside our other scholarships at the BMS awards in November. For additional details about these awards, click this link.

Starting next fall, both scholarships will be given out at \$500 a piece for a couple years until the endowment has reached maturity at which time they will increase to \$1,000 each! The AVC is extremely grateful for the generosity by Howard and are excited about the future for the Zastrow memorial scholarships!


